Draft Unhoused and Equity Work Plan

Goal 1.2 (Priority): Identify and advocate for modifications to policies and practices to remove barriers across the housing continuum for BIPOC, immigrants, migrants, refugees, people with disabilities, LGBTQ+, those with low incomes, and other marginalized populations.

Strategy: Require municipalities to include residential (rural, urban, suburban) input to identify and address redlining, exclusionary zoning, and other discriminatory policies and practices that result in inequities and residential segregation including but not limited to appraisals, assessment of state equalized value, loan application denials, and insurance premiums

KPI Goal: Hold region-wide trainings/workshops on the lasting impact of redlining and exclusionary zoning as it pertains to homeownership rates and the steps to take to rectify these actions.

Owner: Lead RHP

- 1. Explore existing training with MSEU and Kalamazoo Library for examples- Completed
- 2. Create a list of best practices for furthering fair housing, inclusionary zoning, homeownership, zoning ordinances and historic discrimination- Completed
- 3. History of redlining and exclusionary zoning- Completed
- 4. Find example of non-discriminatory ordinance and source of income protection ordinance-Completed
- 5. Add on housing zoning training for a full day- Completed
- 6. Provide education to 10 municipalities Completed

Notes: This Spring RHP Leads worked with MSU Extension to facilitate four workshops on equity in zoning. These workshops were held in three towns across the region, Lawrence, Coldwater and Kalamazoo, to ensure they were accessible to each municipality. One training was hosted virtually for those unable to attend an in-person training.

The in-person workshops were attended by 49 community leaders, realtors, landlords, and other individuals working in the field of housing and development and other interested parties. Participants expressed gratitude for the training and spoke on how they might use the information they were given in their master plans and other projects. See summary attached. The shorter virtual training was attended by 13 individuals. This is recorded and will be posted to the RHP website for anyone to use.

KPI Goal: Create website to share RHP Trainings and other organization trainings.

KPI Goal: Unification of housing messaging by meeting regionally on goals 3 times in 2025

- 2. Subgroup- Advocate through conversations, letters, social media updated training for appraisers at license level class requirements
- 3. Subgroup- Advocate for the passage of Senate Bill (SB 293) with our legislators for more affordable and accessible housing
- 4. Join with the Michigan Coalition Against Homelessness for Source of Income Protection. (Bills have been introduced in the House (HB 4062, 4063) and Senate (SB 205, 206, 207) in 2023 to protect Michigan renters from discrimination based on their source of income.)
- 5. 5 lawmakers, write 10 social media posts, write 5 formal communications with lawmakers, and have 5 direct conversations with lawmakers
